

BY THE NUMBERS LIST

If you're a numbers person, here is breast cancer by the numbers.

Stage at diagnosis, subtype, family history, and ethnicity all play a part in survival rates:

- Approximately **1 in 8 women (13%)** in the US will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer in their lifetime, and **1 in 39 women (3%)** will die from breast cancer
- In **2019**, an estimated **268,600 new cases of invasive breast cancer** were diagnosed (**2,670 cases were men**). That same year, **41,760 and 500 men** were expected to die from breast cancer
- More than **150,000** breast cancer survivors are living with metastatic disease, three-fourths of whom were originally diagnosed with stage I-III
- Based on the most recent data, relative survival rates for women diagnosed with breast cancer are
 - **91%** at 5 years after diagnosis
 - **84%** after 10 years
 - **80%** after 15 years
- More than **3.8 million US women** with a history of breast cancer were alive on January 1, 2019
